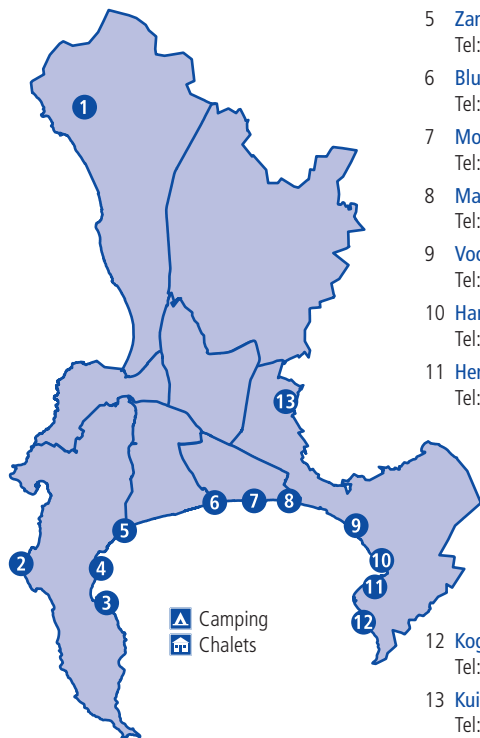

Introduction

Hendon Park is located in Gordons Bay along Faure Marine Drive (R44) between the Gordons Bay Beach and Harbour Island. Convenient shopping centers with a variety of retail shops are located within a 3 km radius. Hendon Park is the largest of the City of Cape Town's resorts.

Activities

The resort is centrally located and provides easy access to:

- Stellenbosch and Helderberg Winelands.
- Strand and Gordons Bay Beaches including Bikini Beach, which has International Blue Flag status.
- The scenic Clarens Drive from Gordons Bay via Kogel Bay and Rooiels to Bettys Bay. Southern right whales are commonly seen along this drive between July and November.
- The hiking trails in the Helderberg Nature Reserve, Steenbras River Mouth, Kogel Bay and the Harold Porter Nature Reserve in Bettysbay.

Environment

Dunes

The front dunes on the seaward side of Hendon Park are part of a sensitive eco system. Care should be taken not to damage the vegetation on the dunes which ensures the stability of the dunes.

Heritage

A shell midden, Dune 111 (Sandkop) is situated inside Hendon Park and is one of the last remaining such dunes along this part of the coast. Hunter-gatherers, ancestors of the San, lived on the dune between 2700 and 3220 years ago.

They left behind a "midden" or rubbish dump. The midden includes the bones of animals they hunted and shells of shellfish they collected.

The shell midden, as other middens, is protected by the National Heritage Resources Act, No 25 of 1999, therefore nothing can be removed from the midden without a permit or permission from Heritage Western Cape.

A planting program will gradually replace exotic Port Jackson with indigenous shrubs and grasses.
